Purpose: To convince someone of God's love and how they can love God

Question: What is something everyone is looking for? Consider some of the places they look for this.

Read 1 John 3:16; Jesus laid down His life for you. Also, read John 3:16; Romans 5:7
What comes first – Man's love for God or God's love for man?

Read carefully the following illustration:

A father had one son. The father was a drawbridge operator for a railroad. He brought his five-year-old son to work one day. The son got his leg caught in the bridge gears and cried out for his father to help him. A radio call came in to notify the father that a train was coming. The father was forced with a decision, either to go get his son out of the gears and let the 1000 people on the train die, or pull the lever, allowing the train to pass through, thus killing his son. In agony, he pulls the lever, crushing his son. He cries out and agonizes over his son. As the train roars by the father watches as some look at the son and then **look away**, some are **too busy** to notice, some **laugh**, others **mock**, others are **hurt and want to repay the father**.

A. This story illustrates five basic ways people respond to the love and sacrifice of Jesus Christ by God His Father. What are they?

B. When it comes to your response to God our Father's love, who have you been on the train?

C. Who are you most like on the train now?

Question: How do you think the father felt when he saw those people? How do you think God must feel? He sacrificed His Son. Consider the beatings and the crucifixion; what does God want from us in return?

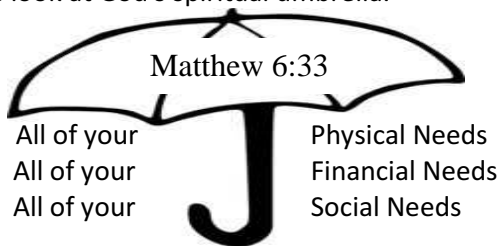
