- 3. Look at the following New Testament passages and discover God's continued plan for shepherding. Write down the general idea of these verses.
 - A. 1 Peter 5:1-4
 - B. Romans 15:1-3
 - C. James 5:19-20
- 4. Whose responsibility is it to be a shepherd of God's people?
- 5. From the verses we've already looked at, why do you think people need shepherding, and what will happen when shepherding isn't taken care of?
- 6. Read John 21:15-17. Three times Jesus commanded Peter to do something. What was the command?

 - G. Make sure they have transportation to and from church
 - H. Hospitalization or bereavement calls are essential
 - I. Notice when they are absent from church. Find out if there is a problem.
