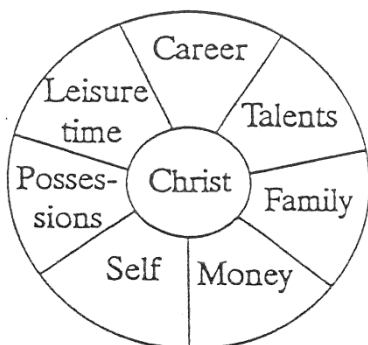

MY OWN STORY: Take inventory of your own life. In “My Heart – Christ’s Home” Bob Munger describes the areas of our lives as the rooms of a house. Give yourself a grade on each room as follows: A = excellent; B = good; C = passing, but needs a little dusting; and D = barely passing, needs a lot of cleaning.

___ LIBRARY: This room is your mind – what you allow to go into it and come out of it; the control room of the entire house.

___ DINING ROOM: Appetites, desires, those things that your mind and spirit feed on for nourishment.

___ DRAWING ROOM: This room is where you draw close to God, seek time with Him daily, not just in times of distress.

___ WORKSHOP: The room where your gifts, talents, & skills are put to work for God, by the power of the Holy Spirit.

___ RUMPUS ROOM: The social area of your life – the things you do to amuse yourself and others.

___ HALL CLOSET: The place that no one knows about but is a real stumbling block in your walk with the Spirit.

Jesus is the Lord of all, or He’s not Lord at all. Take time right now to dedicate yourself completely to Christ. If there are areas not yet surrendered to Christ, do that now.
